David's focus for 2018 continues around the themes of all things KiwiSaver, Decumulation, The Ageing Workforce, and most recently the development of the Sidecar Account to help New Zealanders build stronger financial resilience and reduce the impact of high cost debt to those that can least afford it.

He has more than 32 years' experience in the financial services industry. Before moving to CFFC he was General Manager Funds Management with ANZ Wealth and was responsible for the end to end delivery of their managed and superannuation funds which had some 16bn of assets under management. He has held other national roles with ING, and UDC Finance Limited.

He is a sought-after speaker both at local and international events, a regular commentator in the media, and financial blogger. He hosts "Invested" an on-line video series supported by CFFC and the New Zealand Stock Exchange which is designed to help demystify some of the more complicated area of investing.

Outside CFFC David is on the board for "Stand For Children" a non-government organisation that supports vulnerable children, and he is also a board member of "Play It Strange" a charity focused on helping students develop their song writing skills and performance from the classroom to the stage.
